#### Looking Towards Sunday

"He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God. Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above."" – John 3:2-3

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday -- the first Sunday after Pentecost – when we celebrate the three-fold persons/presence of God: the Creator, the Christ, and the Holy Spirit. Rev. Susan Izard will offer the message based on John 3:1-17. Which describes a secret, nighttime visit between Jesus and a Pharisee named Nicodemus. Jesus explains that no one can see the kingdom of God without being spiritually reborn – a slow or sudden awakening. The sermon is entitled: **A Trinity of Presence**.
