

### Looking Towards Sunday

"Loaves & fish for 5,000...the stories in John and Mark probably have a common ancestor. Indeed, all six versions of the loaves and fish probably go back to a single source, which then developed along slightly different lines."

That quote is from the book <u>The Acts of Jesus</u> by Robert W. Funk and the Jesus Seminar. The book is subtitled: What Did Jesus Really Do? If you're experiencing déjà vu as you read this, that's a good thing! Last week, we looked at the miraculously multiplied meal as recorded in Mark's gospel. I suggested that it showed us how certain 'problems' – rest, empathy, and nurture – can be solved by sharing them.



This Sunday, we'll take a second look at the same story through the lens of the Fourth Gospel (John 6:1-15). The experts theorize that this version serves as a substitute for the last supper (bread and fish rather than bread and wine), which doesn't appear elsewhere in John. Can you believe that? I mean, I'm actually asking again what you think Jesus actually did. I'll say more when I see you. The sermon is entitled: **Gather Up the Fragments Left Over.**



As part of that conference, Jim Boratko, Greg Wilfrid, and Liz Oman-Wilfrid presented a breakout session on alternative worship service ideas. Included in that presentation were sample 15-minute services of the types they have presented at First Church: Taize, Celtic, Labyrinth Walks, and Jazz. It was the most popular session at the conference, with 41 participants registered to join them.
