On Homecoming Sunday, the writer of the Letter of James posed this powerful question: "What good is it, my [spiritual siblings], if you say you have faith but do not have works?" Which sounds like a question but operates like an exhortation: "Faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead." In other words, our convictions and actions are indivisible. The vitality of each depends upon the other.



This Sunday, the same writer encourages further reflection regarding Christian conduct. We're encouraged to consider how Wisdom influences our works. Spoiler alert: Her effect is not easy to detect because there are "earthly, unspiritual, devilish" imposters. I'll say more when I see you.
