# **Sunday Worship**

"Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, but their eyes were kept from recognizing him." Luke 24:13-16

One of my favorite gospel stories pictures two grief-stricken believers walking together in the aftermath of Christ's crucifixion and burial. Their conversation was so captivating, so riveting they didn't notice that the risen Jesus had joined them. Every time I think about it, I want to laugh out loud. The thing that holds me back, though, is the reality that our own eyes often keep us from recognizing the nearness of God.

I don't want to say too much before I see you; but the turning point in the story happens when Jesus was at the table with the two travelers – "he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them." Then...they recognized him! The World Communion sermon is entitled: **Four Eyes**.
