#### Sunday Worship

Last month, the choir sang (and I sermonically suggested) the following strategy: "When God is Silent...Believe in the Silence". The basic premise was that silence and reliance can coexist. We saw that Jesus suffered grave injury upon the cross <u>and</u> maintained great intimacy with God.

We also considered our own relationships with three different types of close companions – the ones with whom we can pick-up-where-we-left-off after an extended absence; the ones who know exactly what to say and when to say nothing; and those with whom we can share elegant quiet time.



Since then, I've received a series of signs that have convinced me to preach the other side of the subject. Which is that sometimes silence is a shortcoming – when we're reluctant to speak, we make certain situations worse. I'll say more when I see you. The message (based on John 18:33-38) is entitled **"A Subsequent Sermon About Silence: To Tell the Truth"**.

#### **Advent Devotionals**

The JPW Library is offering two different Advent devotionals this year. Each contains scripture reflections, personal essays, and prayers to guide our hearts during this very busy, very tender season. Please take just one devotional, so that all who are interested may receive one:

- "Waiting in Joyful Hope" from Saint Benedict's Monastery in St. Joseph, MN includes focuses on the "many stories from people, places, and experiences that can help us come to know the incarnate Christ more deeply." The stories resonate with the theme of life as readers explore the conception, preparation, labor, and beginnings of new life.
- "The Mess in the Messiah" by the StillSpeaking Writers group at UCC/Pilgrim Press has a lighter tone: "The Christmas message of 'God with us' is messy...Angels interrupt a good night's sleep, crusty shepherds and foreign stargazers intermingle, a family flees political persecution...and there is God, in the flesh. This Advent, sort through the mess to find the message! Each day includes a scripture reading, reflection and prayer. Also included: guidance for lighting a weekly Advent wreath in your home."
