


First Church Happenings for the week of March 2, 2025

Exodus 34 describes an important encounter between God and Moses. It was a covenant renegotiation meeting which resulted in ten specified terms etched upon two stone tablets. According to the writer: "[Moses] was there with the Lord forty days and forty nights; he neither ate bread nor drank water. And he wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the ten commandments." You're familiar with the story, yes?

A lesser-known detail (same chapter) is that when Moses came down from Mount Sinai, the skin of his face was beaming because he had been talking with God. The transformation was so obvious that the Israelites were afraid to come near him. So, Moses covered his face with a veil. But, he would remove it whenever he communicated with God.



Sunday's sermon is about being unveiled and reflecting the power of God and shining out loud for others to see. It's entitled **On Again Off Again**.

During the sacred season of Lent, we'll gather midweek to set aside our worldly worries and let the liturgical rhythms guide us in the Way of the Cross. Rev. Laurie Andersen invites you into a quiet prayerful space where you can share or just listen and receive (light refreshments served). Come and see where the Spirit takes us.

This week's offertory is the well-known choral anthem, "Ave Verum", by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. From Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia:

Ave verum corpus ("Hail, True Body"), K. 618, is a motet in D major composed by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart in 1791. It is a setting of the Latin hymn of the same name. Mozart wrote it for Anton Stoll, a friend who was the church musician of St. Stephan in Baden bei Wien. The motet was composed for the feast of Corpus Christi; the autograph is dated 17 June 1791. It is scored for SATB choir, string instruments and organ.

The piece is often sung at Communion services, since it evokes the image of the body and blood of Christ, the elements of Communion. The Latin text with an English translation is as follows:

Ave verum corpus,
natum ex Maria Virgine,
Vere passum, immolatum
In cruce pro homine,
Cujus latus perforatum,
Unda fluxit cum sanguine,
Esto nobis prægustatum
Mortis in exanmine.

Hail, true body,
born of the Virgin Mary,
who, having truly suffered,
was on the cross for mankind.
Whose pierced side
flowed with water and blood:
may it be for us a foretaste (of the Heavenly banquet)
in the trial of death.
