## **Sunday Worship**

"There are two kinds of people in this world: Those who believe there are two kinds of people in this world and those who are [wise] enough to know better." -Tom Robbins

The word of the day this coming Palm-Passion Sunday is 'dichotomous''. It means 'involving two completely opposing things...or themes.'

One of the featured readings (Luke 19:28-40) is concerned with Jesus' triumphal entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. Picture a parade and people spreading their cloaks on the road as Jesus rides on a colt: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

The other featured reading (Luke 22:14-23) is concerned with the Lord's Supper – the final meal that Jesus shared with his friends before his suffering. That setting is where the greatest story ever told takes a sudden turn from pageantry to treachery: "But see, the one who betrays me is with me, and his hand is on the table."

Christian faith challenges us to be the kind of people who can deal with dichotomies. I'll say more when I see you.

Be a blessing. Be the church.

#### April Reach Out: South Park Inn

∞Established in 1982, South Park Inn provides a range of programs and services to assist people experiencing homelessness as they transition back to permanency. The agency's goal is to provide a safe, temporary place to stay as individuals identify the supports and opportunities that will yield long-term housing solutions.

∞South Park Inn's emergency shelter, opened in 1984, operates 24/7/365 and provides 55 beds to men and women. South Park Inn has 15 Transitional Housing beds for Veterans, ten of which are dedicated for high–barrier Veterans exhibiting acute and/or active substance use and mental illness.

∞South Park Inn also operates 17 respite beds to provide people recovering from recent medical or behavioral health hospitalizations with a safe place to stay that includes staffing to monitor for complications/side effects, follow-up care, treatment compliance, and/or medication errors; case management, and rehousing support.

## GHIAA joins movement to protect CT's immigrants

In response to the federal government's increased efforts to deport immigrants -- often without any due process protections -- GHIAA is joining CT immigrant advocates in efforts to strengthen CT's 2019 Trust Act, and to raise awareness of the constitutional rights that all persons here have. GHIAA participated in a rally and press conference on March 3, and expects a public hearing to be held soon, for which we all will be invited to submit comments.

ICE has already begun to increase enforcement activity in CT, causing many immigrant families to fear going to work, going to school, obtaining health care, or participating in their faith communities. It is important for every person or organization who may have contact with ICE to know that they have the right to (a) remain silent when questioned, (b) have an attorney present during any questioning, and (c) be free of unreasonable search and seizure.
