"Stand! They will try to make you crawl. And they know what you're sayin' makes sense and all. Stand! Don't you know that you are free? Well, at least in your mind if you want to be."

Those lyrics were written by Sylvester Stewart (bka Sly Stone). The song was released in 1969 – a year that saw the first moon landing, the Woodstock Music Festival, and the Stonewall Riots in New York City which sparked the gay rights movement.

Some songs are more than musical recordings. Somehow, the sound and the spirit and the statement can coalesce to create a social anthem. Sly issued an inclusive call for people to speak up for themselves, and their communities, and the causes and concerns they believe in.

Sunday's sermon (based on Psalm 139) is an inclusive call to action and alliance with and advocacy on behalf of LGBTQIA persons. Why? Because we're all "fearfully and wonderfully made" by the same inescapable God. I'll say more when I see you.
