#### **Sunday Worship**

"My dearest Lord,
Be thou a bright flame before me,

The lyrics of this Sunday's offertory anthem were originally penned by Columcille (aka Columba) who is widely celebrated in Ireland as a gifted poet, writer, and raconteur. Columba was a person of faith and vision who is said to have successfully founded forty-one monasteries in forty-one years across Ireland. He was also familiar with failure having been found guilty of copying a book of psalms that belonged to a fellow monk.



Forced into exile as the result of his "sin", Columba set sail toward the island of Iona. He gave himself unreservedly to God's care, asking God to surround him on all sides – before, above, beneath, and behind. When I see you, I'll say more about the saint and about being surrounded.

The sermon is entitled: Everywhere (Season Finale): A Prayer of Saint Columba.
