I didn't say it at the start; but we've since embarked upon a three-part sermon series about dreams. Two weeks ago, we studied the last line of the Epiphany story (Matthew 2:12) in search of answers. What might it mean to be warned in a dream? Who did the warning? Whose voice said, "Go home by another way."



Last week, we considered Peter's public speech to the Gentiles in Caesarea (Acts 10:34-43). Peter declared, "I truly understand that God shows no partiality...anyone who respects God and does the right things is acceptable to God." We learned that his realization was derived from a daydream.

This Sunday -- MLK Sunday -- we'll consider Dr. King's timeless message about long-held desires and deeply rooted dreams. No, not that one.

January Reach Out: South Park Inn

Founded in 1982, South Park Inn provides a range of programs and services to assist people experiencing homelessness as they transition back to permanency. The agency's goal is to provide a safe, temporary place to stay as individuals identify the support and opportunities that will yield long-term housing solutions. South Park Inn's emergency shelter, opened in 1984, operates 24/7/365 and provides 55 beds to men and women. South Park Inn has 15 Transitional Housing beds for Veterans, ten of which are dedicated for high-barrier Veterans exhibiting acute and/or active substance use and mental illness. South Park Inn also operates 17 respite beds to provide people recovering from recent medical or behavioral health hospitalizations with a safe place to stay that includes staffing to monitor for complications/side effects, follow-up care, treatment compliance, and/or medication errors; case management, and rehousing support.

Your support changes lives! When you donate to South Park Inn, you support our mission to improve our community by providing equal access to shelter and solutions for all people to make homelessness rare, brief, and non-recurring. The cycle of homelessness CAN be broken, and it happens with your support!

Book: *Short Stories by Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi* by Amy Jill Levine. "Jesus was a skilled storyteller and perceptive teacher who used parables from everyday life to effectively convey his message and meaning. Levine relates a robust sense of what Judaism was and wasn't in Jesus' day, and she does so without chiding, showing how the parables are not just about Jesus, but are also about us—and when read rightly, still challenge and provoke us."
